

Educator Voting Resources



High schools in Texas are required to offer voter registration to eligible students at least twice a year. Some college students are also new to voting. Students may be excited to vote for the first time in the next election! Here's how to help them, whether online or in-person.

Voter Registration

Online: Send the 'Student Voting Resources' document to students to inform them about how to get a voter registration application online and how to vote. www.lwvcollin.org/new-voters

In-person: Provide mail-in voter registration forms to students. Send email to lwvcollin@gmail.com if you want LWV-CC to deliver forms to your school.
