



History

The League of Women Voters is an outgrowth of the woman suffragist movement. In 1919, Carrie Chapman Catt, president of the National American Woman Suffrage Association (NAWSA), proposed a nonpartisan, nonsectarian League of Women Voters to obtain enfranchisement of women in every state, abolish legal discriminations against women in state codes and constitutions, and make democracy safe for the nation and the world. The League of Women Voters was first formed as a section within NAWSA and composed of organizations within states where suffrage had already been attained. At their convention in Chicago the following year, NAWSA dissolved itself and formally organized the League of Women Voters of the United States on February 14, 1920. Six months later, the 19th Amendment to the US Constitution was ratified, giving women the right to vote after a 72-year struggle.

The League of Women Voters of Texas was formed on October 19, 1919, in San Antonio, when the Texas Equal Suffrage Association was dissolved. LWV-Dallas began as a branch of LWVTX in 1938. In spring 1974, a member of LWV-Dallas, Meg Titus, put an ad in the Plano Star Courier about starting a local league, and approximately 50 women responded. The first official meeting of the Provisional LWV of Plano was held August 27, 1974. The League of Women Voters of Plano was officially recognized in September 1976. As it grew a county-wide focus, the name was changed to LWV-Plano/Collin County (1986) and subsequently to LWV-Collin County (2013).
